 18. The Post-graduate teacher who teaches a minimum of 6 periods of theory of post-graduate classes shall be allowed the benefit of teaching of 20 periods instead of 24 periods per week.
- B.Ed. 24 periods per week including the periods of discussion lessons but excluding those for extra curricular activities.
- 20. M.Ed. 20 periods per week including the periods of discussion lessons but excluding those for extra-curricular activities.

Provided that a teacher who takes up teaching work both for B.Ed. and M.Ed. classes, shall be assigned 20 periods per week including the periods of discussion lessons but excluding those for extra-curricular activities:

- (i) Periods assigned for a tutorial group shall be additional periods over and above the maximum periods already laid down by the University.
- (ii) (a) Tutorial groups should be functional. The Principals should themselves ensure that when admissions are over, the tutorial groups should start functioning two or three days thereafter so as to provide intimate contact between the teachers and

- it will be the duty of the Principals to ensure that the students and lecturers are regular in attendance.
- (d) A consolidated record of tutorials of each student should be maintained in the form prescribed by the University.

III. Minimum number of lectures to be delivered in each subject in a year to Arts and Science classes:

- (a) for all Arts and Science classes the minimum number of lectures to be delivered in a subject shall be 120 where that subject is taught for six periods in a week;
- (b) the number of lectures for those subjects in which teaching per week is either less than six periods or more than six periods shall be worked out proportionately;
- (c) in the case of M.A. subjects the minimum number of teaching periods, ranging from 45 to 60 minutes, should be six per week so that the minimum number of lectures delivered in each paper of the subject is also 120, inclusive of seminar work, etc.
- for a Science subject, a College shall provide atleast one teacher for every 20 (or a fraction of 20) students doing laboratory work at the same time, except that in the case of Physics Practicals for B.Sc. Parts II and III, the number of students working under supervision of one Demonstrator or Lecturer shall not exceed 16.
 - V The duration of each period in a college shall be of 45 minutes both in summer and winter in respect of B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. I, II & III and B.Ed classes.
